## **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**



I had just hopped off the wild ride that was directing the hilarious chaos of *Bullshot Crummond* when I was asked if I'd like to take on *Squabbles* for this season. My first thought? "Squabbles? Isn't that the show with the poster that's been staring at me from the rehearsal hall wall since forever?" Turns out it was! Dewdney staged it back in 2000—before my time—but I've been side-eyeing that poster since I joined the Dewdney family in 2006. I figured it was time to see what all the squabbling was about.

With curiosity piqued, I decided to give the script a read. What I found was a warm, thoughtful comedy with a meaningful message. While it's a different style from the broad, physical comedies I'm typically drawn to, I was moved by its heart—and I agreed to take it on

For this show to work, while keeping that heartwarming core—we knew the characters had to feel real. Not just funny, but relatable, loveable ... like a quirky family that might live just down the street. From our very first read-through, we dove into character work. I dusted off some old theatre tricks from my "tickle trunk" (yes, it's a real thing), and we spent the first part of each rehearsal exploring each character's backstory—everything from their hobbies and education to their pet peeves, odd habits, what item will always be in their refrigerator (insiders know), and the choices that shaped who they are. We worked these details into the blocking and performances, building out the hidden layers of the story—the things you might not see written on the page, but you'll definitely feel on stage, the 'story behind the story' of *Squabbles*. The cast embraced this process wholeheartedly, and I'm incredibly proud with the result.

Community theatre thrives on collaboration and passion. Every person involved in this production has volunteered their time and talent to make it a success, and I'm grateful to each and every one of them. Thank you from the bottom of my heart! Thank you for joining us. We hope you enjoy *Squabbles*.

**About the Author:** Before collaborating with best selling author James Patterson, Marshall Karp was in advertising, where the punishment for creating award-winning TV campaigns is to put the writer in charge of an entire department and tell him to stop writing ads.

Trapped in a corner office, Karp wrote a play, "Squabbles," which attracted the attention of network executives. He created "Everything's Relative," a CBS comedy starring Jason Alexander, moved to LA to become writer/producer for the NBC hit, "Amen," then served as writer/co-executive producer for ABC's "Baby Talk" and several other long forgotten TV series. A feature film, "Just Looking," directed by Jason Alexander, was released in 2000. Karp returned to NY, and in 2006 he fulfilled a long-time fantasy by killing many of the people he worked with in Hollywood. His first novel, "The Rabbit Factory," set in a Disneyesque studio, introduces LAPD Detectives Mike Lomax and Terry Biggs. Four more Lomax and Biggs mysteries followed ("Bloodthirsty," "Flipping Out," "Cut, Paste, Kill" and "Terminal"). In 2011 he coauthored the #1 NY Times bestseller "Kill Me If You Can" with James Patterson. A second collaboration, "NYPD Red," followed in 2012. The book spawned a series and "NYPD Red 2" "NYPD Red 3" and "NYPD Red 4," all best sellers, followed. "Red Alert," the fifth in the series, is scheduled for release in March 2018.

In 2002 Karp joined the Board of Advisors of Vitamin Angels and is one of the architects of Operation 20/20, whose goal is to prevent blindness and dramatically reduce mortality rates among the 200 million children around the world who suffer from Vitamin A deficiency.
